AWARD DESCRIPTIONS

George Schwab Distinguished Service Award - This award recognizes an individual who has provided the greatest service to the Association in a given year. The award is given in memory of George Schwab, President of IADDA from 1979-1980, who symbolized the sacrifice and commitment of professionals in the alcohol/other drug field. Nominees should be individuals who have made significant personal contributions to IADDA and to the alcohol/drug field. Dr. C. Vincent Bakeman Memorial Award – Dr. C. Vincent Bakeman was a pioneer and visionary in the field of addiction prevention and treatment. Dr. Bakeman envisioned a society where addiction prevention and treatment services are available to all people. His tireless efforts to communicate this vision to the people of the field, members of the community and policy makers made possible the significant advancements in substance abuse services over the last two decades in Illinois and around the country. Dr. Bakeman was never satisfied with the status quo, constantly advocating for those around him to go the extra mile. The award, instituted in 2004, is a celebration of the tireless work done by our leaders in the field of substance abuse services. Nominees should be people who are dedicated to speaking up for prevention and treatment, have a clear vision for the future of the field, consistently communicate
